

Fair Isle Hat
 Designed by Andrea Mielke Schroer
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While not technically a true “fair isle” pattern, this is a nice easy pattern for learning two-color stranded knitting.

Gauge: 5 sts = 1”

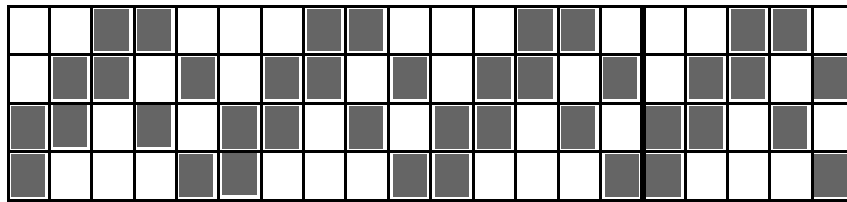
Materials: 16” circular needle to give you the gauge above with worsted weight yarn; a set of double points in the same size; tapestry needle; ruler.

Cast on 88 sts.

K2, p2 for 3 inches.

Increase 12 sts “evenly” spaced.

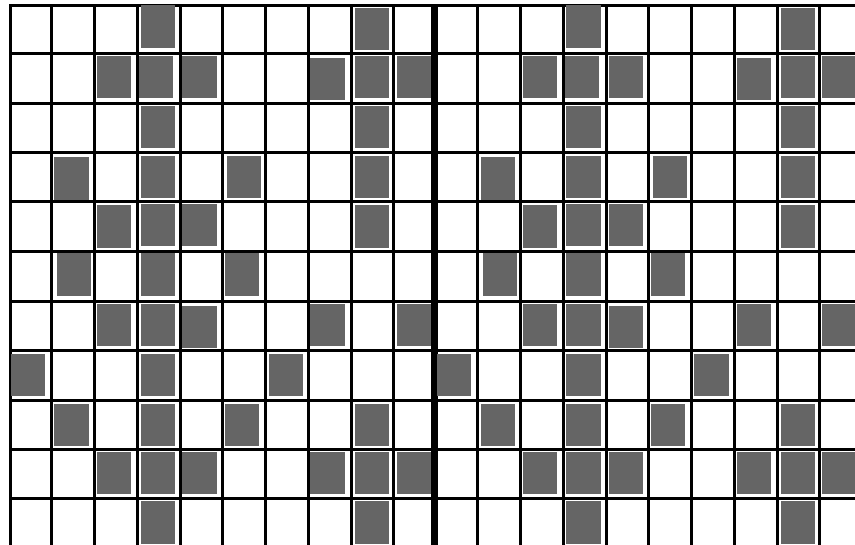
Pattern A



Knit four rounds plain. Begin pattern A. Note: Read chart from right to left, bottom to top.

| one repeat |

Pattern B



After completing pattern A, knit two rounds plain and begin pattern B. Note: Read chart from right to left, bottom to top.

| one repeat |

To Decrease: (Change to double points when necessary)

Knit 8, k2tog around. Knit two rounds plain.

Knit 7, k2tog around. Knit two rounds plain.

Knit 6, k2tog around. Knit two rounds plain.

Knit 5, k2tog around. Knit two rounds plain.

Knit 4, k2tog around. Knit two rounds plain.

Knit 3, k2tog around.

Knit 2, k2tog around.

Knit 1, k2tog around.

K2tog around.

K2tog around.

5 sts remain. Place on one double point and do I-cord for desired length. To finish off, break yarn and run through remaining sts twice. Darn in ends on inside.
